# The Municipality received a \$45,300;00 Grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation's Resilient Communities Fund Program.

The funding has been granted for the completion of a study to determine the feasibility of a Non-motorized Active Travel Trail stretching from the Village of Killarney to the Killarney Provincial Park. This longtime considered project has been identified as having the potential to boost economic growth for the community and create a recreational benefit for residents and visitors to the Municipality. The study will investigate possible trail routes, design options, identify potential demand and usership, user and maintenance needs and infrastructure costs.

# The Municipality received a \$70,000;00 Grant from the Ontario Trillium Foundation's Resilient Communities Fund Program.

Funding was granted for upgrades to the Municipal Building Public Washrooms at 32 Commissioner Street. The renovations, which included the installation of accessibility features, baby change tables, new washroom stalls, nonslip flooring and touch free fixtures have helped the Municipality rebuild and recover from impacts of COVID-19. This project has resulted in increased accessibility and a greater ability to ensure the most sanitary environment for the continued health and safety of residents and visitors.

### The Killarney Municipal Wharf Expansion and Redesign Project Update

A Public Information Centre was held on February 15th from 6-8 pm at the Veteran's Hall to give residents and stakeholders opportunity to discuss the project and provide input on the preliminary alternative design options and information presented by EXP. The Geotechnical Investigation and Design Report has been completed. The preliminary design is expected to be completed in July, the detailed design in August, with the final redesign report completed in September, 2023.

The Municipality also announced the purchase of the "Channel Marina" property with the vision of a long-term plan for the development and beautification of the Village's Channel Street Water Front.

#### Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Carbon monoxide (CO) is known as the silent killer because it is an invisible, tasteless and odourless gas that can be deadly. Over 65% of CO-related injuries and deaths in Ontario occur in the home.

CO is produced when fuels such as propane, gasoline, natural gas, heating oil or wood do not burn completely in fuel-burning appliances and devices, such as: furnaces, fireplaces, hot water heaters, stoves, Barbeques, portable heaters, generators and vehicles.

**Exposure to CO can cause:** Headaches, nausea, dizziness, confusion, drowsiness, loss of consciousness and even death.

If your CO alarm sounds, you may experience symptoms of CO poisoning. It is critical to get everyone out of the home immediately and **call 9-1-1** from outside the building.
