

Notice of Completion

Municipal Class Environmental Assessment Study for Killarney Municipal Wharf Improvements



The Municipality of Killarney has completed a Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) study to improvements to the municipal wharf located at 21 Channel Street South in the Village of Killarney. This study was undertaken to address the wharf's deteriorating condition and to improve its resilience to elevated lake water levels.

The study was conducted as a "Schedule C" project under the Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (March 2023), which is approved under the *Ontario Environmental Assessment Act*. Through this Class EA process, the Project Team evaluated alternative solutions and designs and selected a recommended design, all in consultation with the public and regulatory agencies.

An Environmental Study Report (ESR) documenting the planning process undertaken, details of the study recommendations as well as potential impacts and mitigation measures, has been completed and is being made available for public review. Subject to comments received following this Notice and the receipt of approvals, the Municipality intends to proceed with implementation of the recommended project as outlined in the ESR (funding dependent). 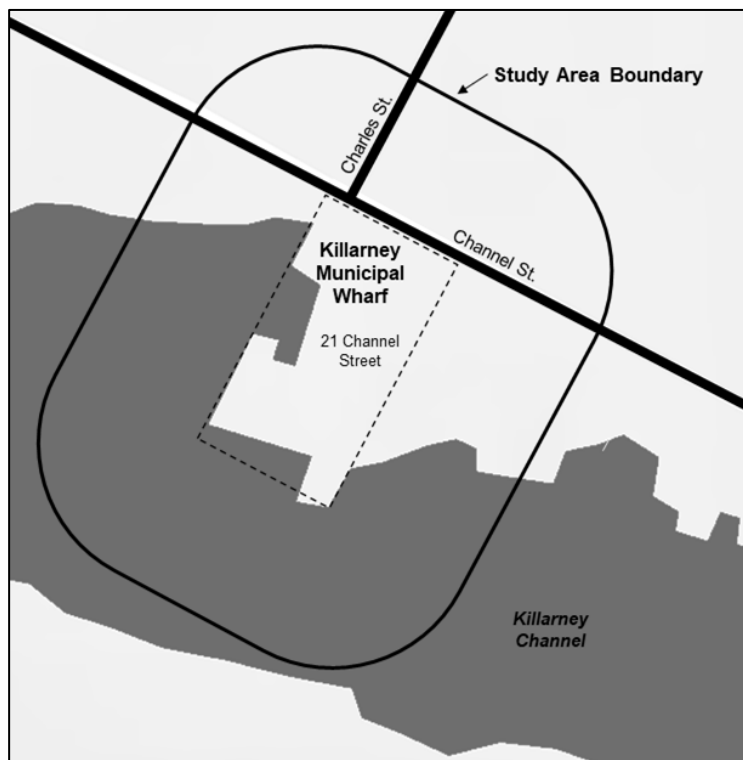

In addition, a request may be made to the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks for an order requiring a higher level of study (i.e. requiring an individual/comprehensive EA approval before being able to proceed), or that conditions be imposed (e.g. require further studies), only on the grounds that the requested order may prevent, mitigate or remedy adverse impacts on constitutionally protected Aboriginal and treaty rights. Requests on other grounds will not be considered. Requests should include the requester contact information and full name.

Requests should specify what kind of order is being requested (request for conditions or a request for an individual/comprehensive environmental assessment), how an order may prevent, mitigate or remedy potential adverse impacts on Aboriginal and treaty rights, and any information in support of the statements in the request. This will ensure that the ministry is able to efficiently begin reviewing the request.
