Mayor Reider called meeting to order at 7:05 P.M., proceeded with roll call and acknowledged meeting on aboriginal land.

Mayor called for a moment of silence and then proceeded to ask Council if there were any declarations of pecuniary interest. Each councillor announced they had no disclosure.

Mayor Reider welcomed members of the public for attending and then introduced the guest, Tim McBride, Director with Pinchin Ltd.

The Mayor advised that the purpose of the public meeting was to discuss the cancellation of the Village Clean-Up Week scheduled for May, as well as the closure of LifeLabs services in Sudbury due to their relocation to Mississauga.

The first topic for discussion was the suspension of Clean-Up Week in May. The Mayor addressed those in attendance by reading Resolution No. 26-011, passed by Council at its Regular Meeting held on January 14, 2026, outlining the rationale for suspending the Clean-Up Week.

Mayor Reider then invited Tim McBride to provide an overview of the technical aspects of the landfill expansion project, including challenges encountered over the years and the potential implications should the Ministry of the Environment, Conservation and Parks (MECP) require closure of the municipal landfill due to capacity limitations.

Mayor Reider opened the floor to questions and comments from Council and the public.

Members of the public expressed concerns and offered several alternative options for Council's consideration in lieu of cancelling the program.

The second item on the agenda was a discussion surrounding LifeLabs and their relocation to Southern Ontario.

Mayor addressed the public by reading Resolution No. 26-048 passed by Council at their Regular Meeting held February 11th, 2026.

Mayor stated that this service is essential to the North, he asked everyone to sign a petition that we can forward to the Premier.
