BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Municipality of Killarney supports Resolution # RC26092 passed by the Municipality of Wawa on May 5th, 2026, formally requesting that the Province of Ontario consider amending the Land Transfer Tax Act to:

1.

Increase the value threshold at which the first-time home buyer rebate fully offsets provincial Land Transfer Tax to a level that reflects current housing market realities (for example, to no less than \$675,000, aligning with the 2025 national average home price); and

2.

Increase the maximum rebate amount available to first time home buyers accordingly (such as to a minimum of \$8,000, or a proportional figure tied to the new threshold) to meaningfully reduce upfront tax costs for first-time purchasers.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT such amendments be designed to enhance housing affordability and access to homeownership for first-time buyers in urban, suburban, and rural communities alike;

WHEREAS Council acknowledges the receipt of information from Paul Sullivan, Principal – Practice Leader Advocacy and Tax Policy Canada regarding the frozen assessment roll in Ontario; and

WHEREAS a well-functioning and up-to-date assessment system supports strong communities and makes the province an attractive place to invest; and

WHEREAS property assessments in Ontario have not been updated in over a decade, making them the most outdated in Canada, while provinces such as Alberta and British Columbia update assessments annually to reflect current market conditions; and

WHEREAS the prolonged pause in the reassessment cycle has created significant distortions in assessed values, resulting in inequities among property classes; and

WHEREAS outdated assessments negatively impact investment decisions, economic competitiveness, municipal planning, and disproportionately affect independent small businesses; and

WHEREAS reassessments are designed to be revenue neutral for the municipality, ensure fairness in taxation, maintain public confidence in the property tax system, and support long-term municipal financial planning; and

WHEREAS a coalition of municipalities, chambers of commerce, tourism organizations, small businesses, and major property owners have called upon the Government of Ontario to update property assessments;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Council of the Municipality of Killarney hereby calls upon the Premier of Ontario and the Minister of Finance to direct the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation to promptly resume the regular property assessment cycle; and

1. Ensure that records related to government business remain accessible to the public; and
2. Consult with the Information and Privacy Commissioner of Ontario and the public before proceeding with any amendments to FIPPA;

WHEREAS the Municipality of Killarney recognizes the ecological, cultural, and economic importance of Georgian Bay and its interconnected watershed;

AND WHEREAS TC Energy has undertaken drilling and pre-development activities in Georgian Bay in 2025, and additional drilling activities are occurring or anticipated in 2026 in connection with the proposed Ontario Pumped Storage Project in the Municipality of Meaford;

AND WHEREAS the results of prior drilling activities have not yet been made publicly available, resulting in limited information for municipalities and the public to assess potential environmental impacts;

AND WHEREAS the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada has determined that a federal impact assessment is required for the proposed project, and has identified key environmental, health, and socio-economic concerns through its Summary of Issues, for which the proponent has been required to provide responses as part of an ongoing review process;

AND WHEREAS drilling and pre-development activities are continuing while federal review processes remain ongoing and key issues are still under consideration;

AND WHEREAS the proposed project is located on lands under the jurisdiction of the Department of National Defence (DND), where access for feasibility and pre-development activities has been provided on a temporary or conditional basis, while broader land use determinations and approvals remain under review;

AND WHEREAS the lands in question are actively used by the Canadian Armed Forces for training purposes and are not surplus to Defence requirements, and the proposed project may require the relocation of military infrastructure and could have implications for ongoing training operations;

AND WHEREAS the Canadian Armed Forces are continuing to invest in and modernize training infrastructure and operations at this site, while assessments regarding the potential impacts of the proposed project on military operations remain ongoing;

AND WHEREAS the project area includes karst topography (soft limestone prone to sinkholes), which may present risks to groundwater systems and environmental integrity;

AND WHEREAS questions remain regarding potential contamination associated with prior military use of the site;

AND WHEREAS municipalities within the Georgian Bay region share a collective interest in ensuring that development activities proceed only following transparent, coordinated, and comprehensive review processes.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

1. The Council of the Municipality of Killarney expresses its concern regarding ongoing and proposed drilling and pre-development activities associated with the TC Energy Ontario Pumped Storage Project;
2. Council respectfully calls upon the Province of Ontario and the Government of Canada to ensure that:
 - The results of all completed drilling activities are publicly released in a timely and accessible manner;
 - The proponent's responses to the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada's Summary of Issues are made publicly available and appropriately reviewed;
 - All current and future drilling activities are subject to rigorous environmental monitoring and public transparency;
 - Potential risks related to karst topography, groundwater protection, and aquatic ecosystems are fully assessed prior to further activity;
 - Any potential contamination related to previous land use is identified and addressed;
 - The potential impacts on Canadian Armed Forces operations and infrastructure are fully assessed and considered;
3. Council further requests that consideration be given to pausing ongoing and future drilling and pre-development activities until:
 - The federal impact assessment process has advanced sufficiently to address key identified concerns;
 - The proponent's responses to identified issues have been made public and reviewed; and
 - Outstanding federal review processes, including land use determinations and operational impact assessments by the Department of National Defence, have been appropriately completed;
4. Council supports continued communication and collaboration among municipalities, Indigenous communities, and relevant provincial and federal agencies regarding the protection of Georgian Bay and the consideration of regional impacts;
5. That a copy of this resolution be circulated to:

 - The Minister of Energy and Mines
 - The Minister of National Defence
 - The Impact Assessment Agency of Canada
